

## **SIMON A. LEVIN**

### **Narrative Biography**

**Simon A. Levin** is the James S. McDonnell Distinguished University Professor in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at Princeton University. He received his B.A. from Johns Hopkins University and his Ph.D. in Mathematics from the University of Maryland. Levin is a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a Member of the National Academy of Sciences and the American Philosophical Society, and a Foreign Member of the Istituto Veneto and the Istituto Lombardo. He is a University Fellow of Resources for the Future, a Fellow of the Beijer Institute of Ecological Economics, a Fellow of the Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics, a Fellow of the Society for Mathematical Biology, a Fellow of the American Mathematical Association, a Distinguished Fellow of the Luohan Academy, and a Fellow of the Academia Europaea. He is a former President of the Ecological Society of America and the Society for Mathematical Biology, Chair of the Council of IIASA, Chair of the Board of the Beijer Institute, and Chair of the Science Board of the Santa Fe Institute. He has received numerous awards including the Kyoto Prize in Basic Sciences, Heineken Prize for Environmental Sciences, Margalef Prize for Ecology, Tyler Prize for Environmental Achievement, the U.S. National Medal of Science, and most recently, the BBVA Foundation Frontiers of Knowledge Award in Ecology and Conservation Biology. He has mentored more than 150 Ph.D. students and Postdoctoral Fellows.
